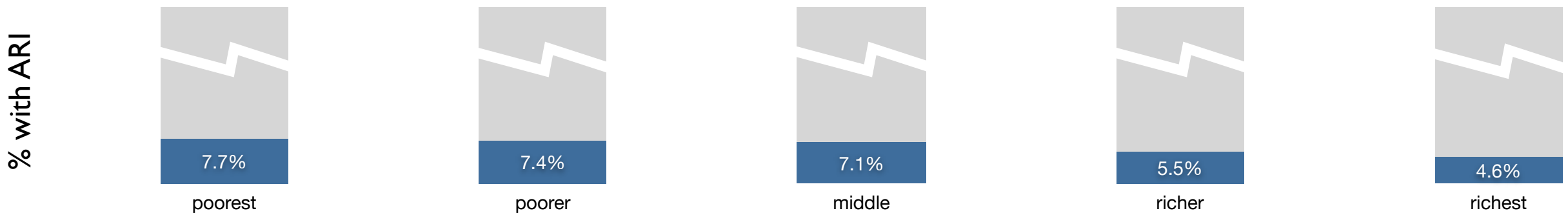
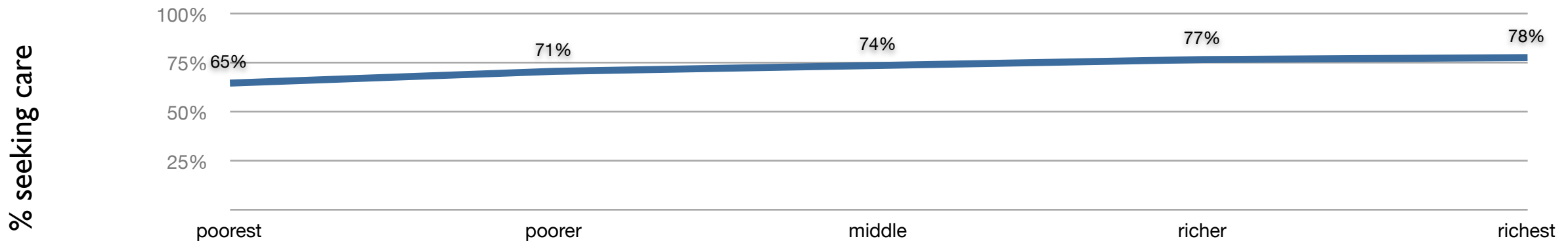
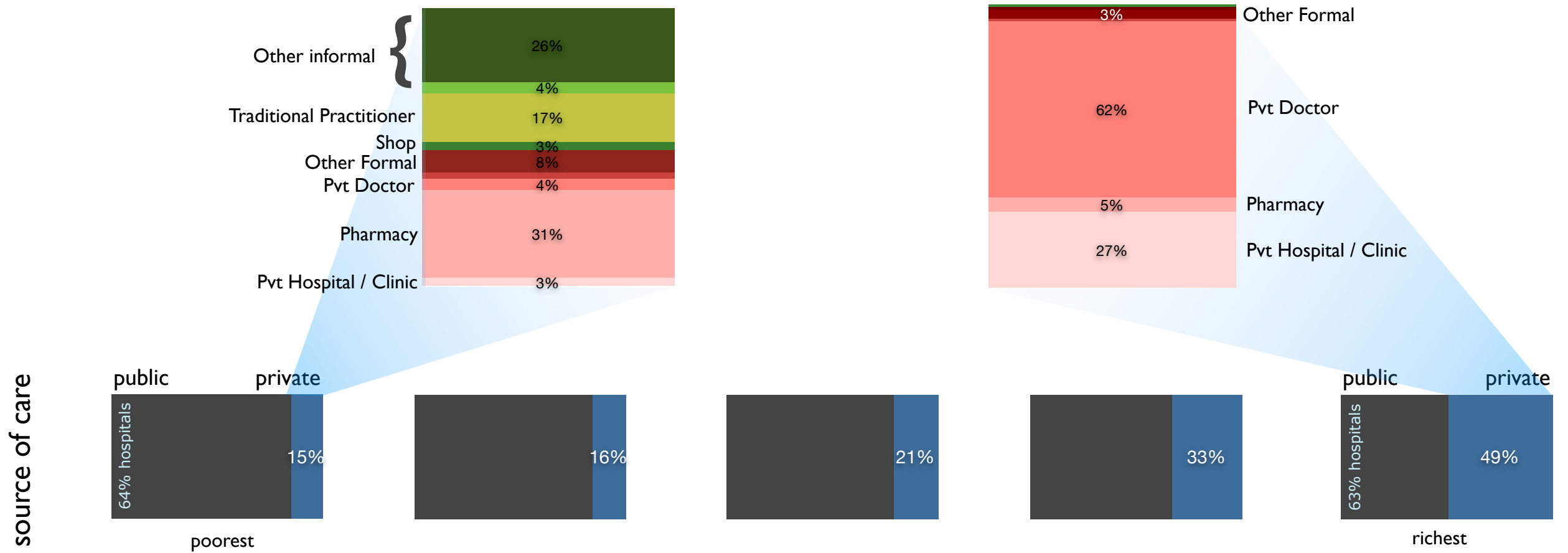


Latin America and Caribbean: Pneumonia



Notes

- All data is drawn from Demographic and Health Surveys in Latin America and the Caribbean
- Acute Respiratory Infections are defined according to the more rigorous, post 2004, DHS definition by *asking mothers whether their children under age five had been ill in the two weeks preceding the survey, with a cough accompanied by short, rapid breathing which the mother considered to be chest-related*
- Source of treatment is a summary of respondents with <5 children reporting treatment in the prior two weeks for ARI.
- The number within the ‘public’ source of treatment box is the percent of all those seeking care in the public sector who report going to hospitals
- Countries included: Columbia, Dominican Republic, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, Peru
- For regional estimates, data is weighted proportionate to national population
